

YOUR GUIDE TO WAGE SUBSIDIES

Wage subsidies are financial incentives you can access by hiring eligible job seeking customers. To receive a wage subsidy your new employee must be registered with an employment service provider.

What wage subsidies are available?



MATURE AGED WORKERS

up to \$10,000 if you hire someone aged 50 years or older



YOUNG PEOPLE

up to \$10,000 if you hire an eligible young person aged 15-29




INDIGENOUS AUSTRALIANS

up to \$10,000 for eligible Indigenous job seeking customers



PEOPLE WITH DISABILITY

up to \$10,000 eligible job seeking customers who has disability



LONG TERM UNEMPLOYED

up to \$6,500 if you hire an eligible customer who has been registered with Workskil Australia for at least 12 months



PARENTS

up to \$6,500 for principal carer parents

How do wage subsidies work?

Wage subsidies are paid every three months across a six month period.

To receive wage subsidy payments in accordance with the schedule you must provide evidence within 7 days of the request. To receive the final wage subsidy payment you must provide evidence within 28 days of the wage subsidy end date. All payments are subject to the evidence being provided within these time frames and eligibility requirements being met. If these time frames are not met, you may no longer be eligible for a payment and Workskil Australia may refer the matter to the funding agency for a decision. A specified time frame can be found in your initial wage subsidy paperwork.



What types of jobs are eligible?

- ✓ Full time or part time
- ✓ Meets Australian employment standards
- ✓ Casual employment, provided it is ongoing
- ✓ Minimum 20 hours per week averaged over six months*
- ✓ Ongoing Apprenticeship or Traineeship
